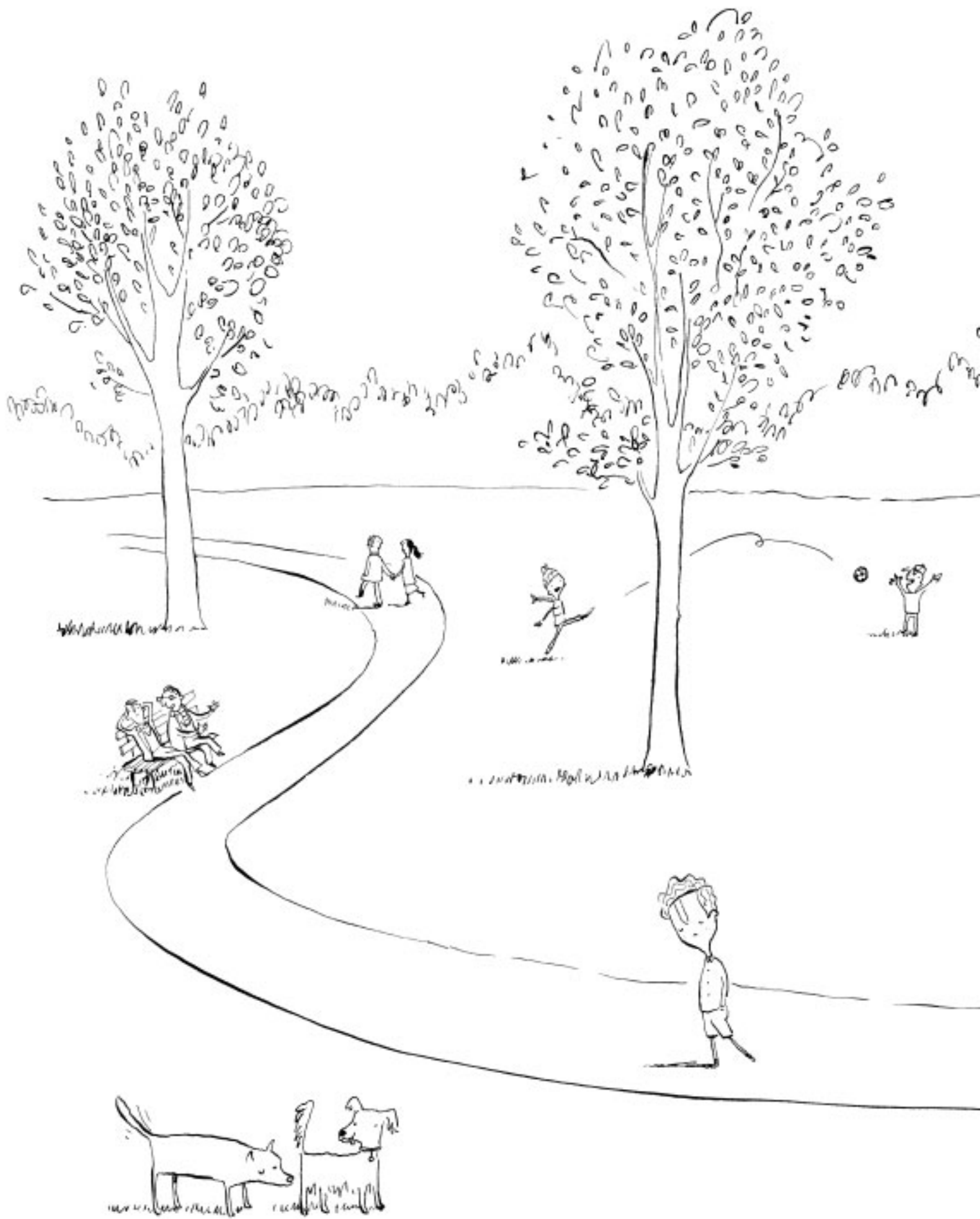

Usually this is true. You can wish and wish until your hair stands on end, but no imaginary friend will appear.

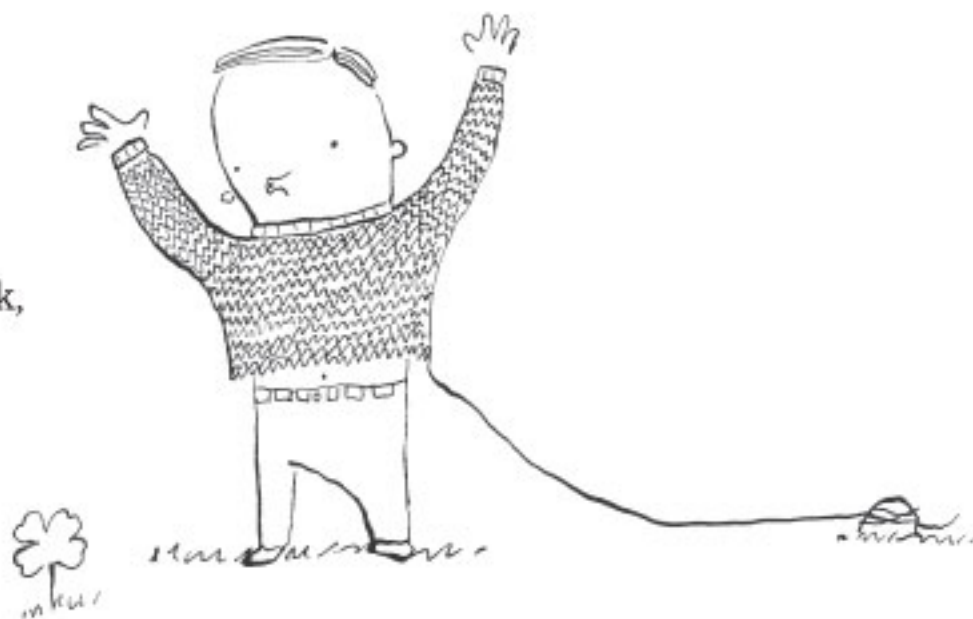
Unless...

and if you add a little electricity,

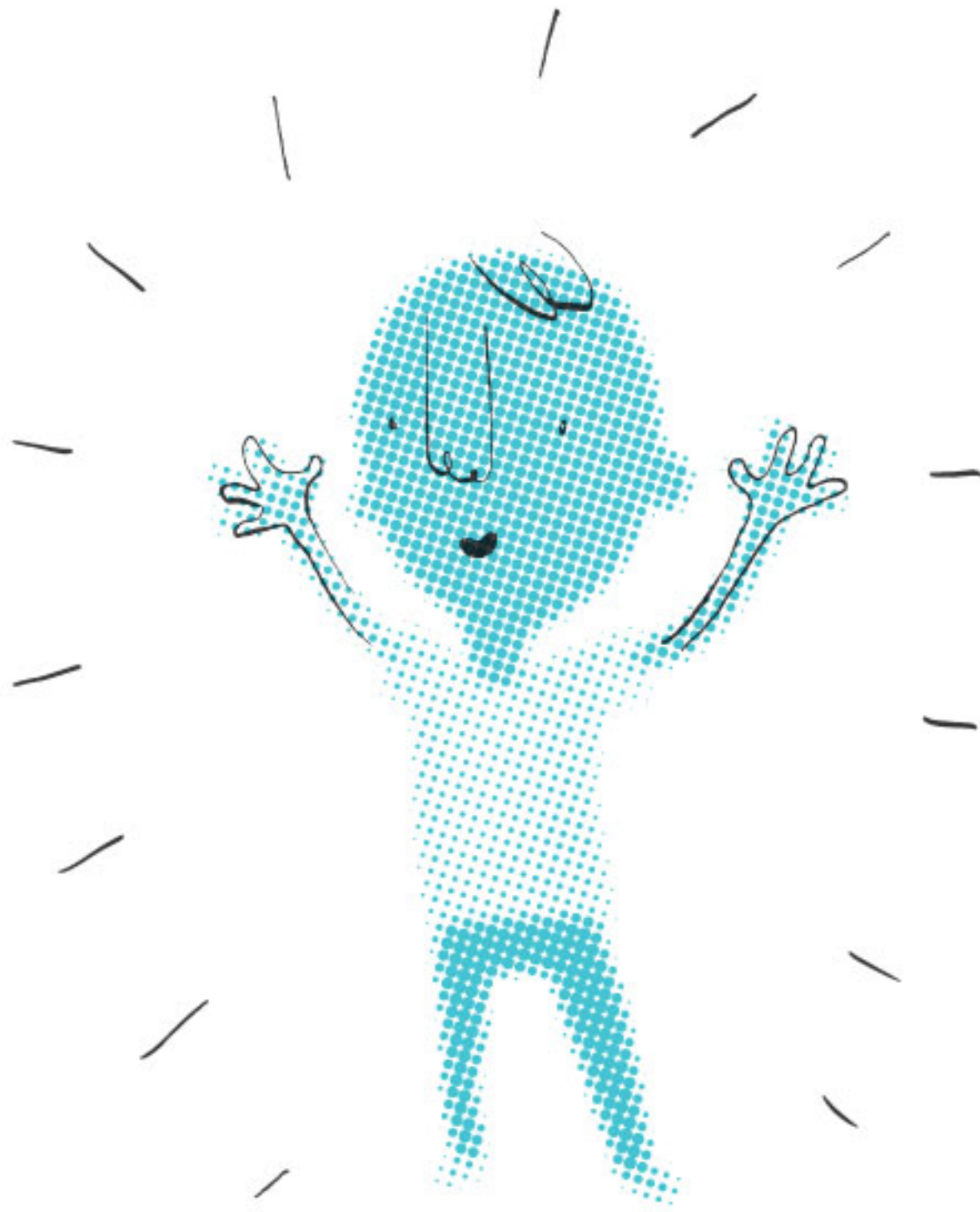
or luck,
