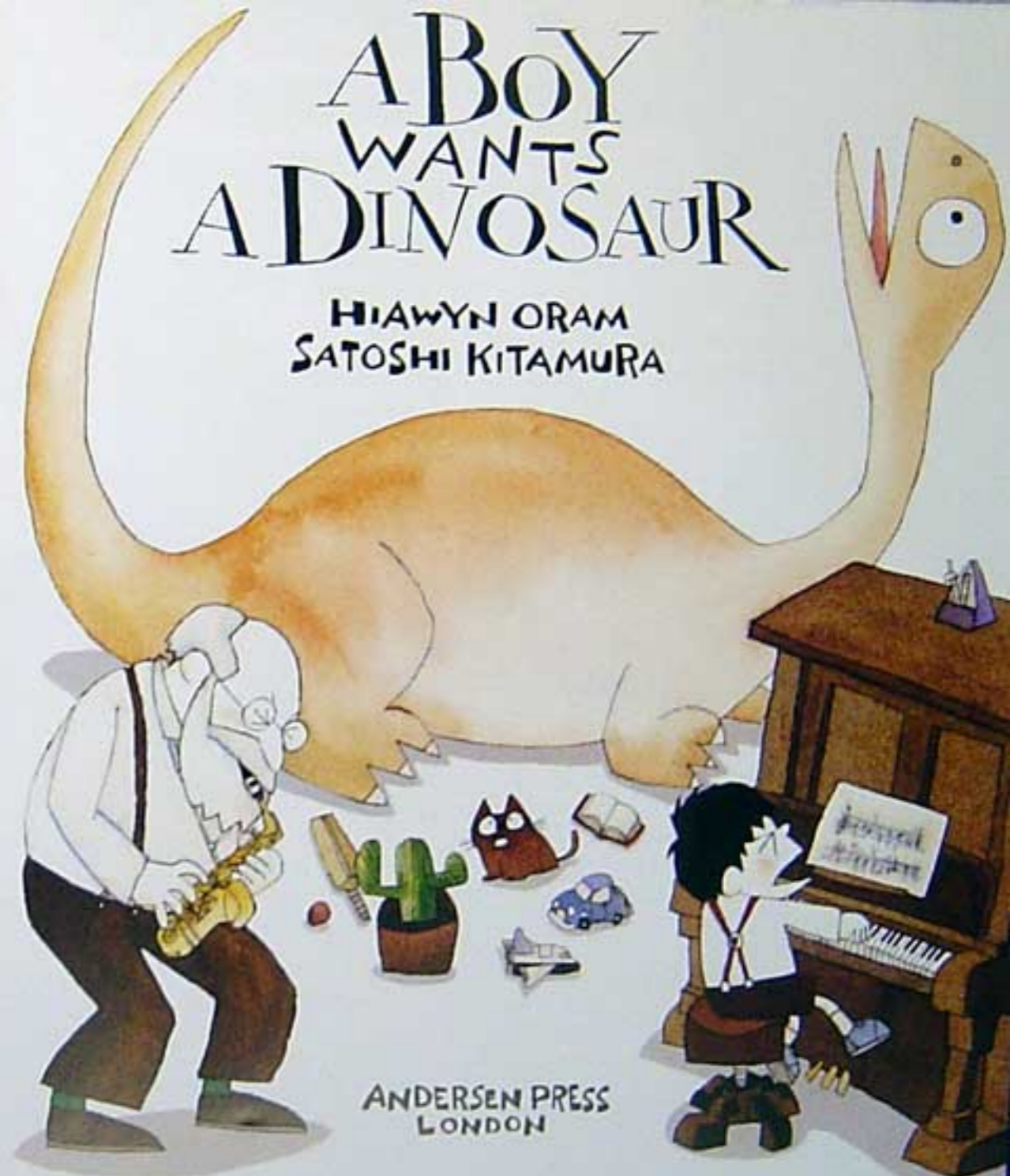

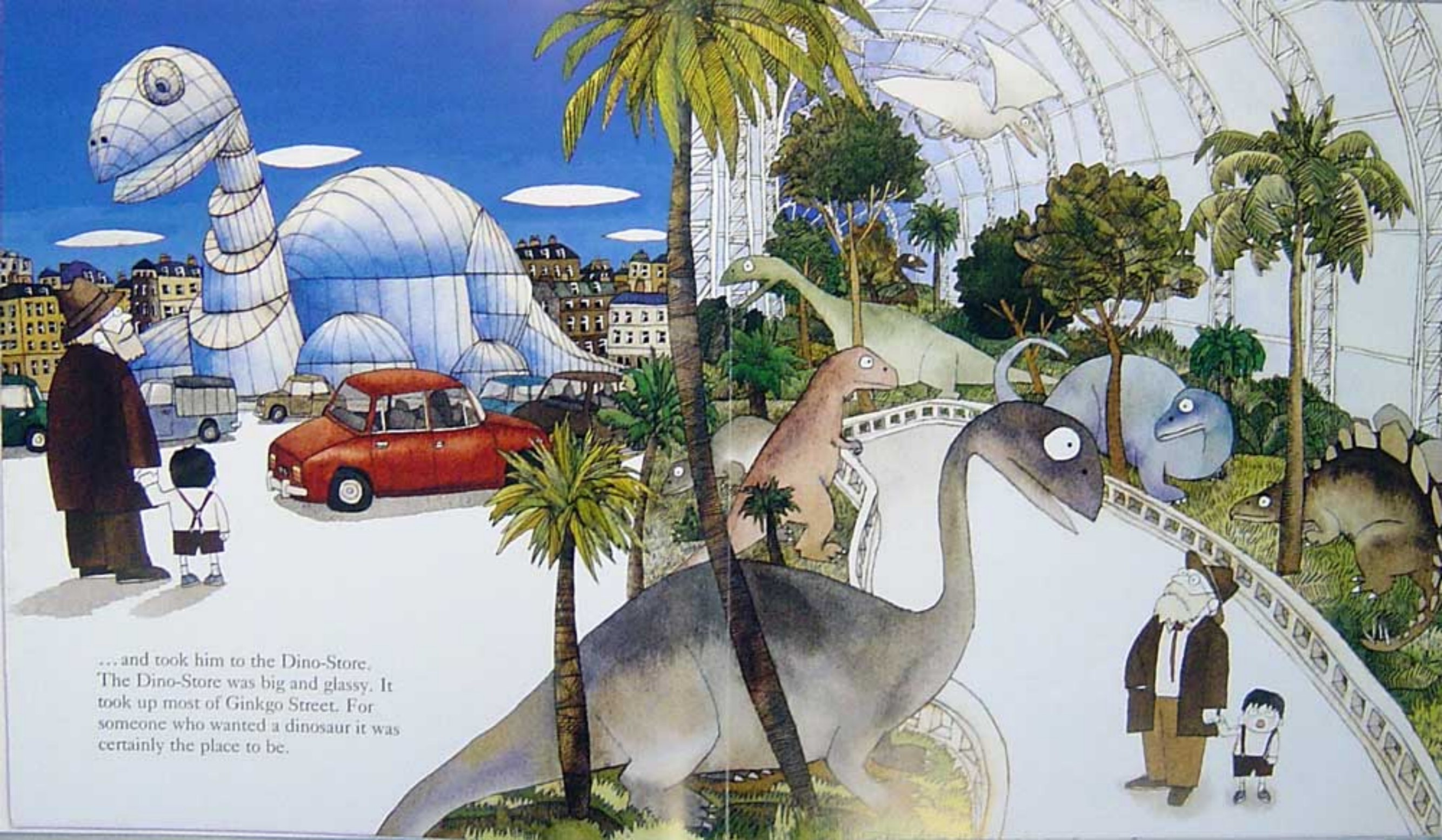


Ben had a dog.
