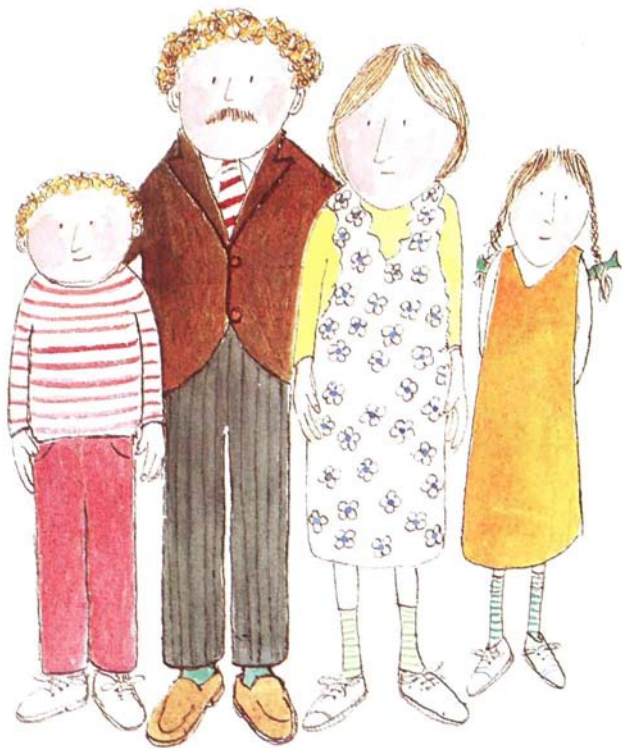

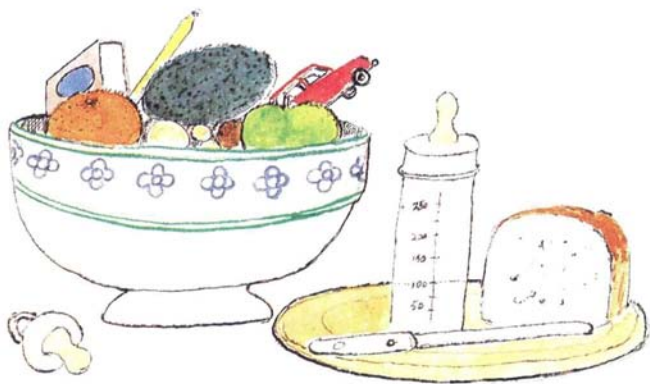




“Whatever can I do,” wailed Mrs Hargraves.

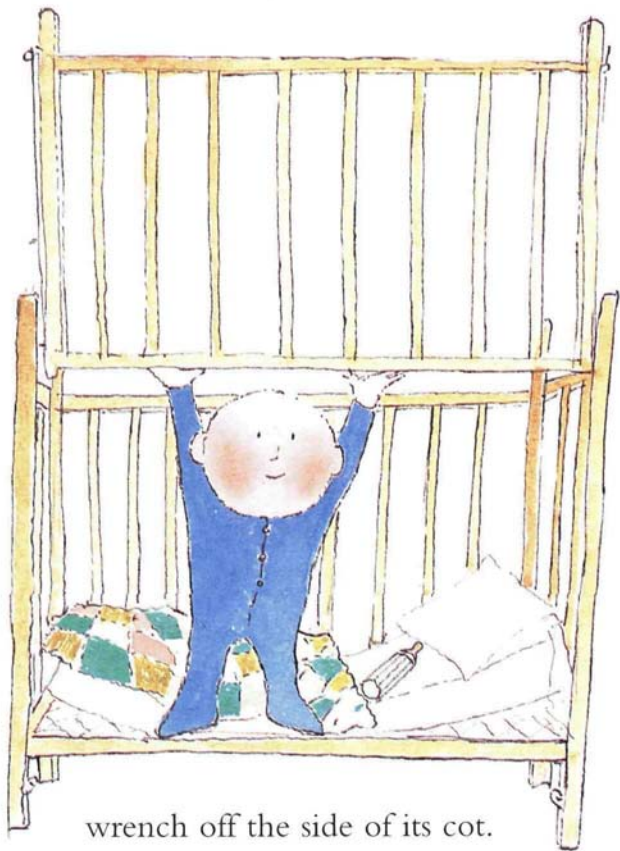


It was getting so strong it could
