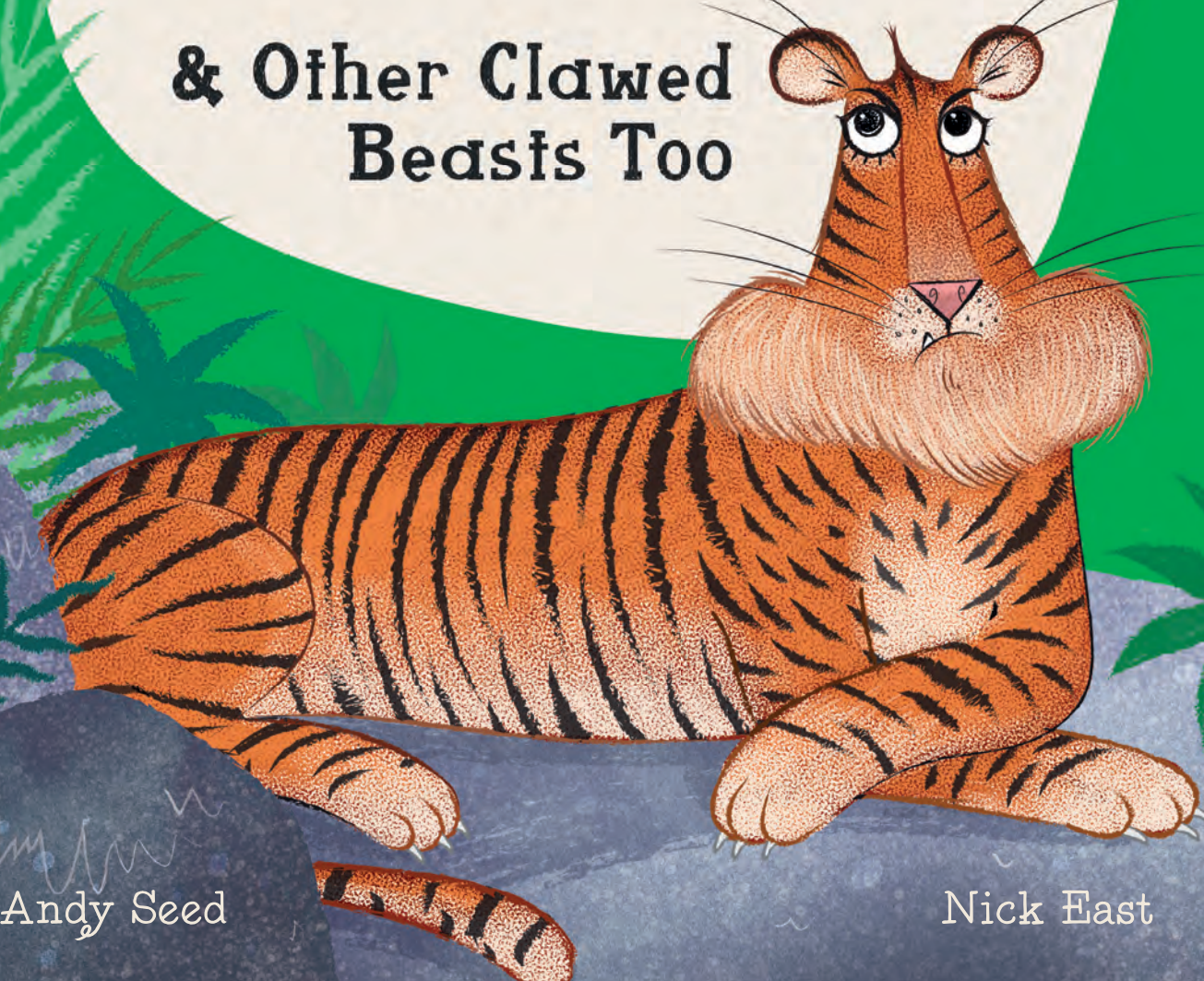

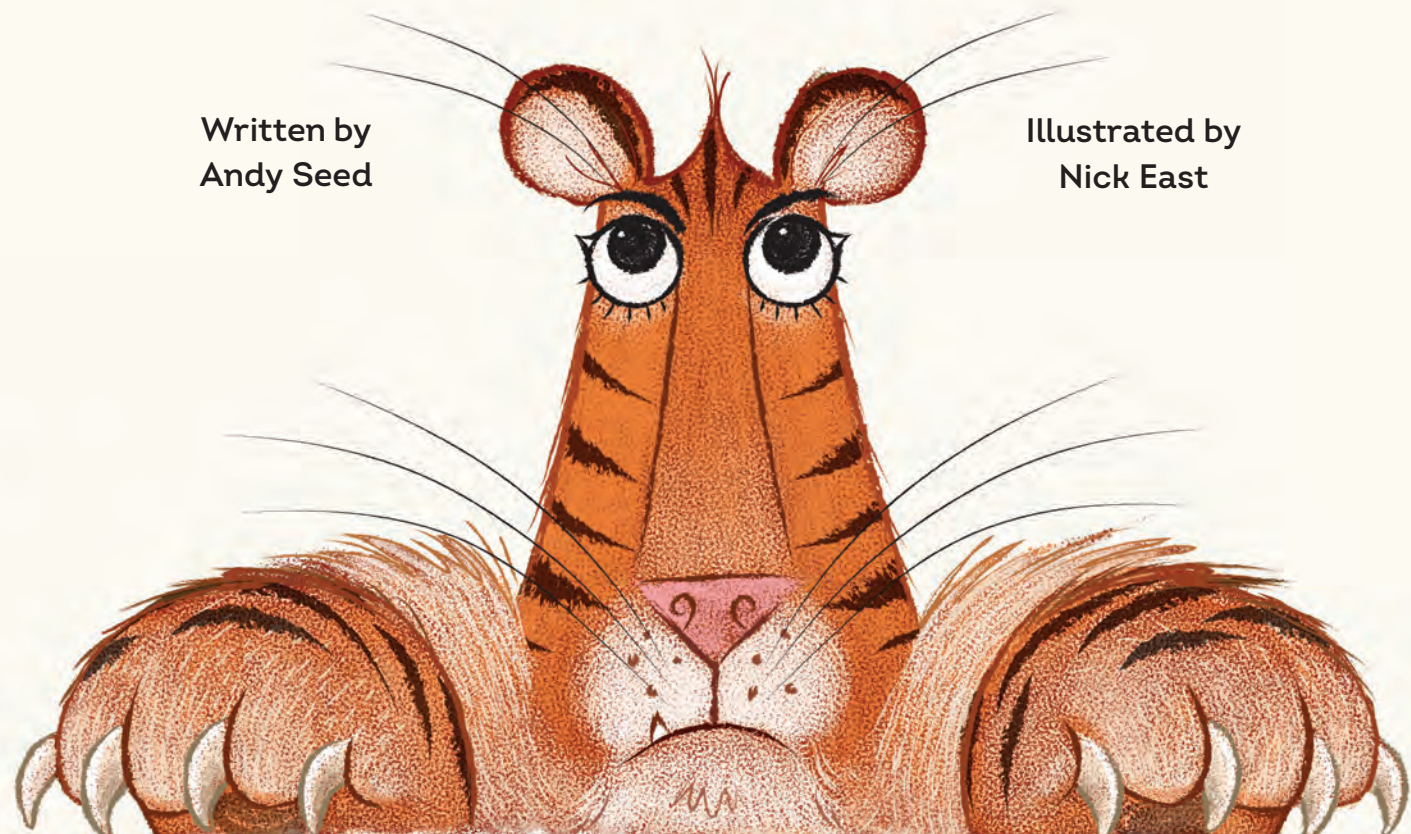

**Q: What is your ideal day?**

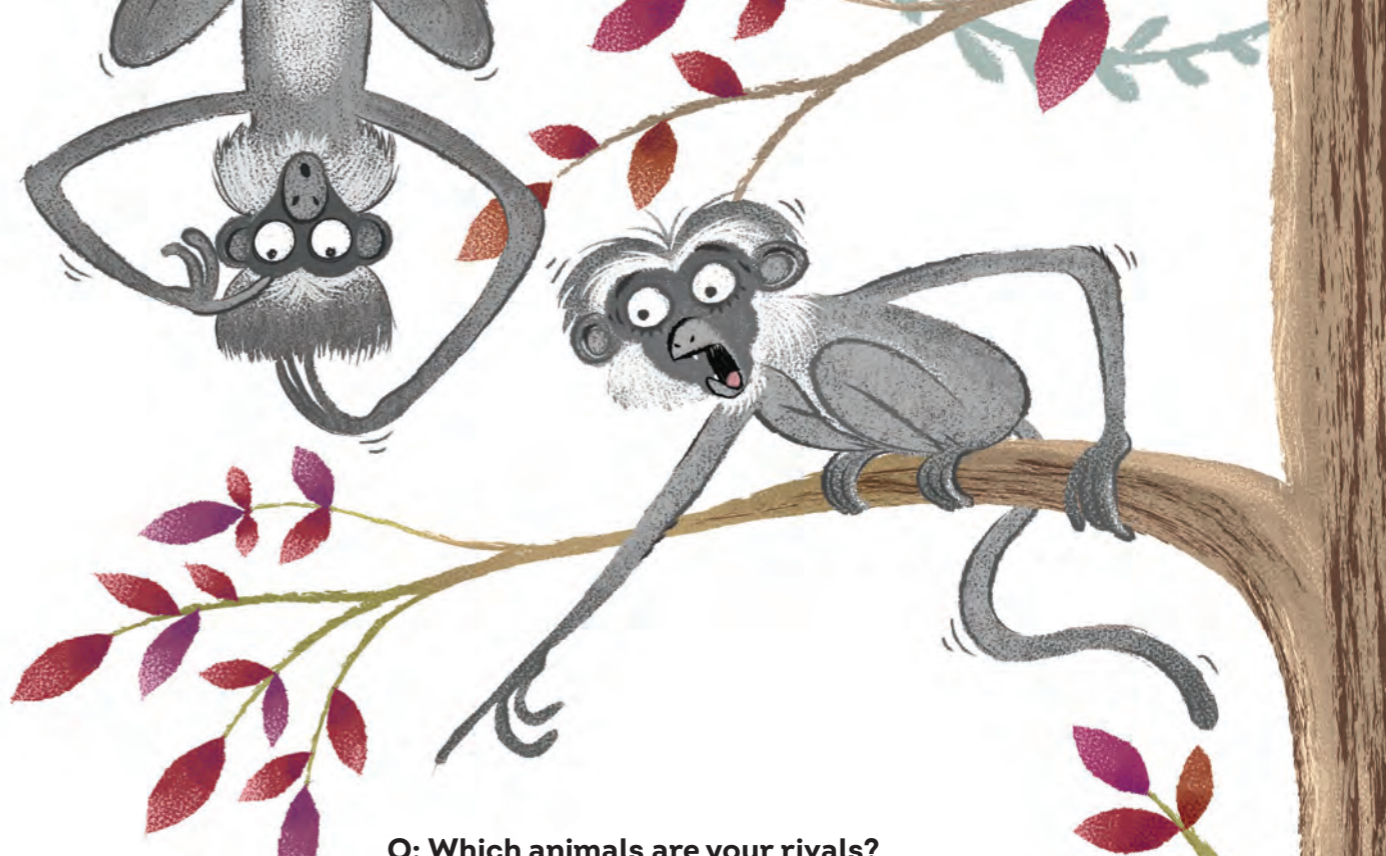

**Q: What about humans?**

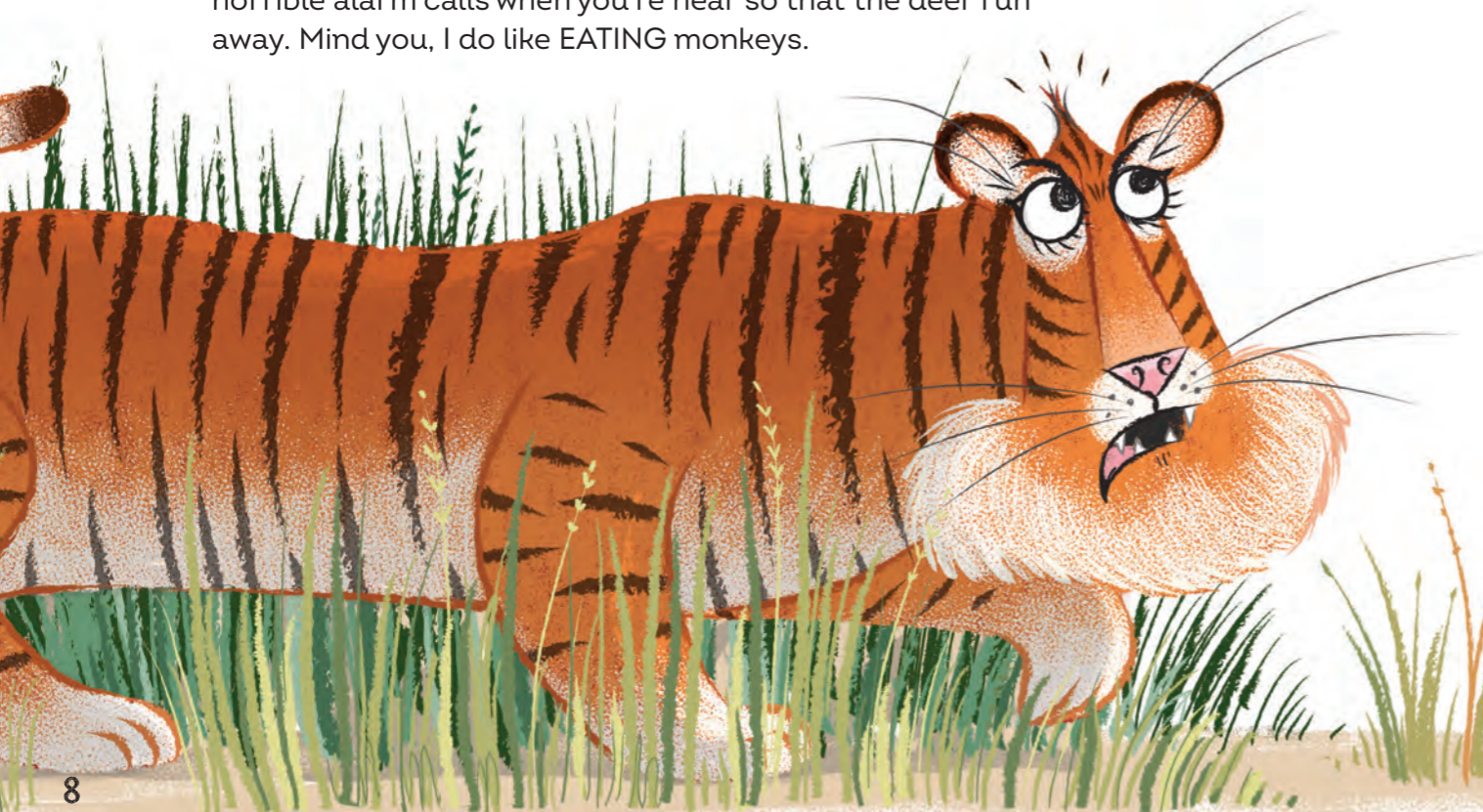
A: Oh yes, you lot... The only animal we're really afraid of, with your guns and poaching and taking away our hunting grounds to build houses on. Grrrrr!

# Interview with a Wolf

My next special guest loves to roam the great northern forests of Asia and America. He's got yellow eyes, 42 big teeth and he's, er, quite grumpy by the look of things. I bring you... a WOLF!

**Q: First off, do you howl at the moon?**

A: No. Don't be ridiculous. Do *you* howl at the moon?

**Q: Fair point. But why do you howl?**

A: Isn't it obvious? There are times when a yelp or a growl or a whimper won't do. We howl to stay in touch with the pack or maybe frighten off other wolves.

**Q: You mentioned a pack.**

**What's that?**

A: Sheesh, don't you know anything? It's a kind of extended family group. We work together to hunt and patrol our territory and defend each other.



**Q: What sort of animals do wolves hunt?**

A: The bigger the better – more to eat. Deer are good, or caribou or elk. Or bison. Or beaver. Or musk ox. Yum.

**Q: So, how exactly do you deal with an animal that's bigger than you?**

A: Weren't you listening? Pah. We work as a pack. Chase it, tire it out, separate it from others, bite it, injure it, then drag it down. Teamwork.

**Q: Er, can you tell me why?**
