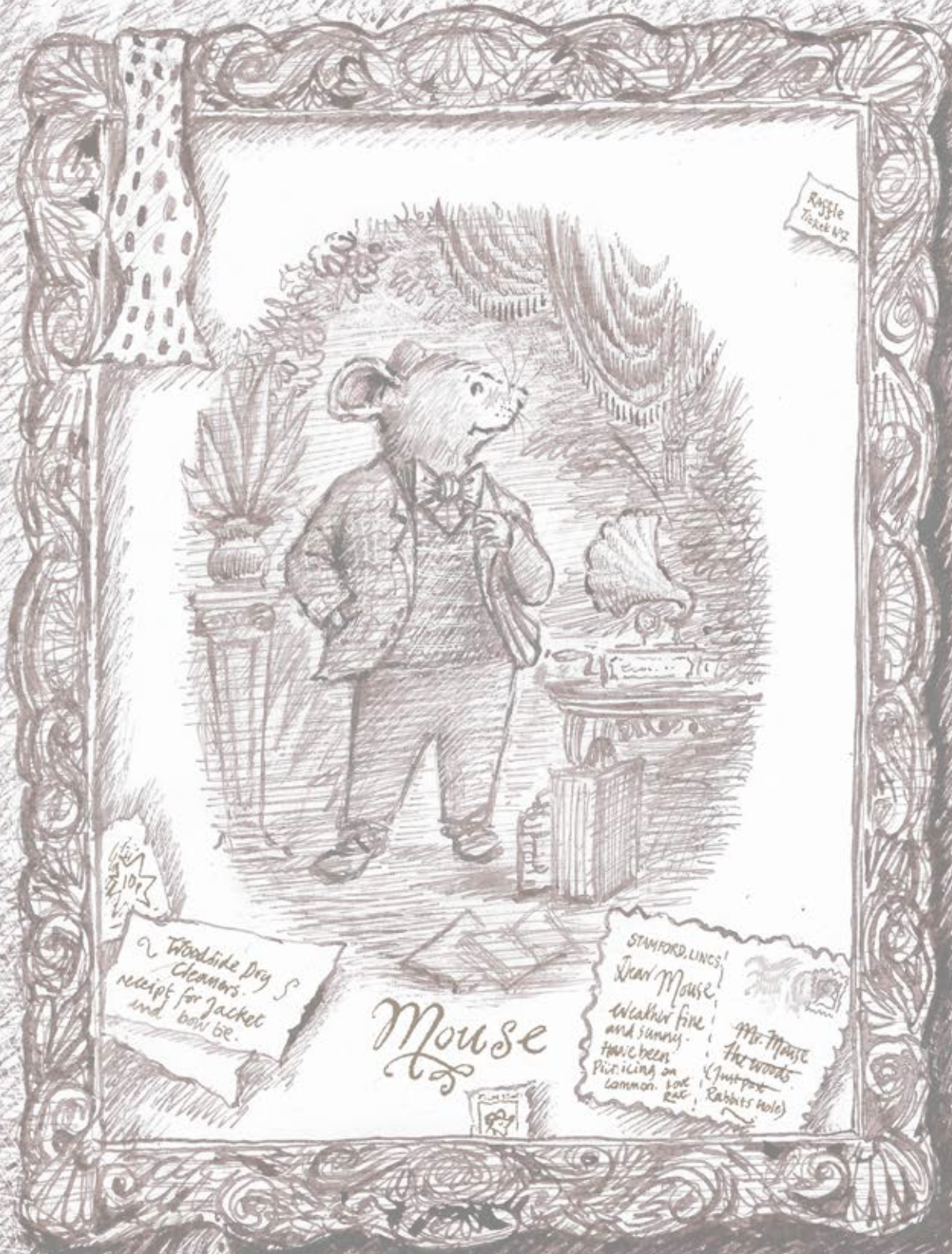

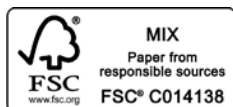

So did Mouse.

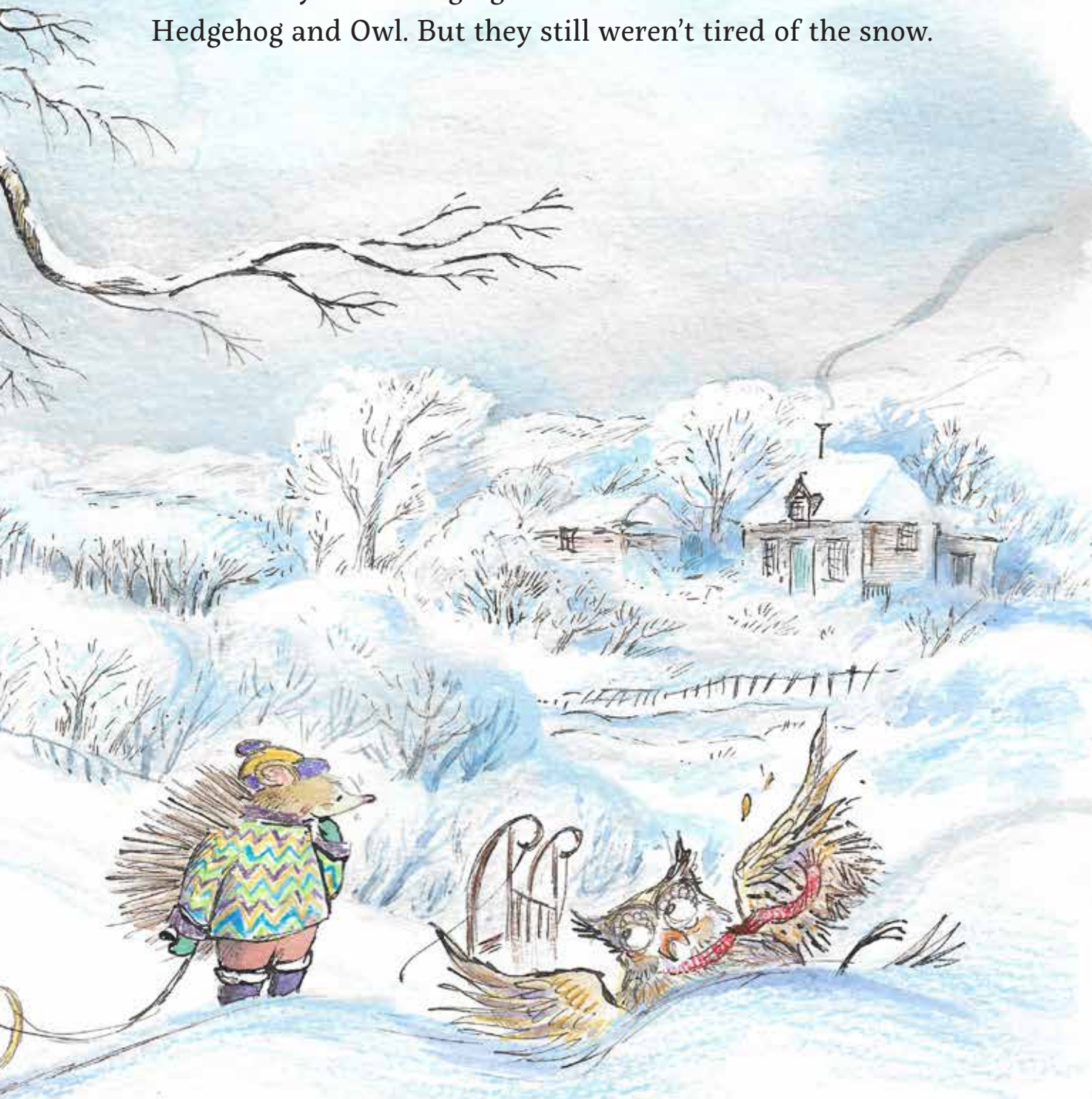








Then they went sledging with Rat and Rabbit and Hedgehog and Owl. But they still weren't tired of the snow.
