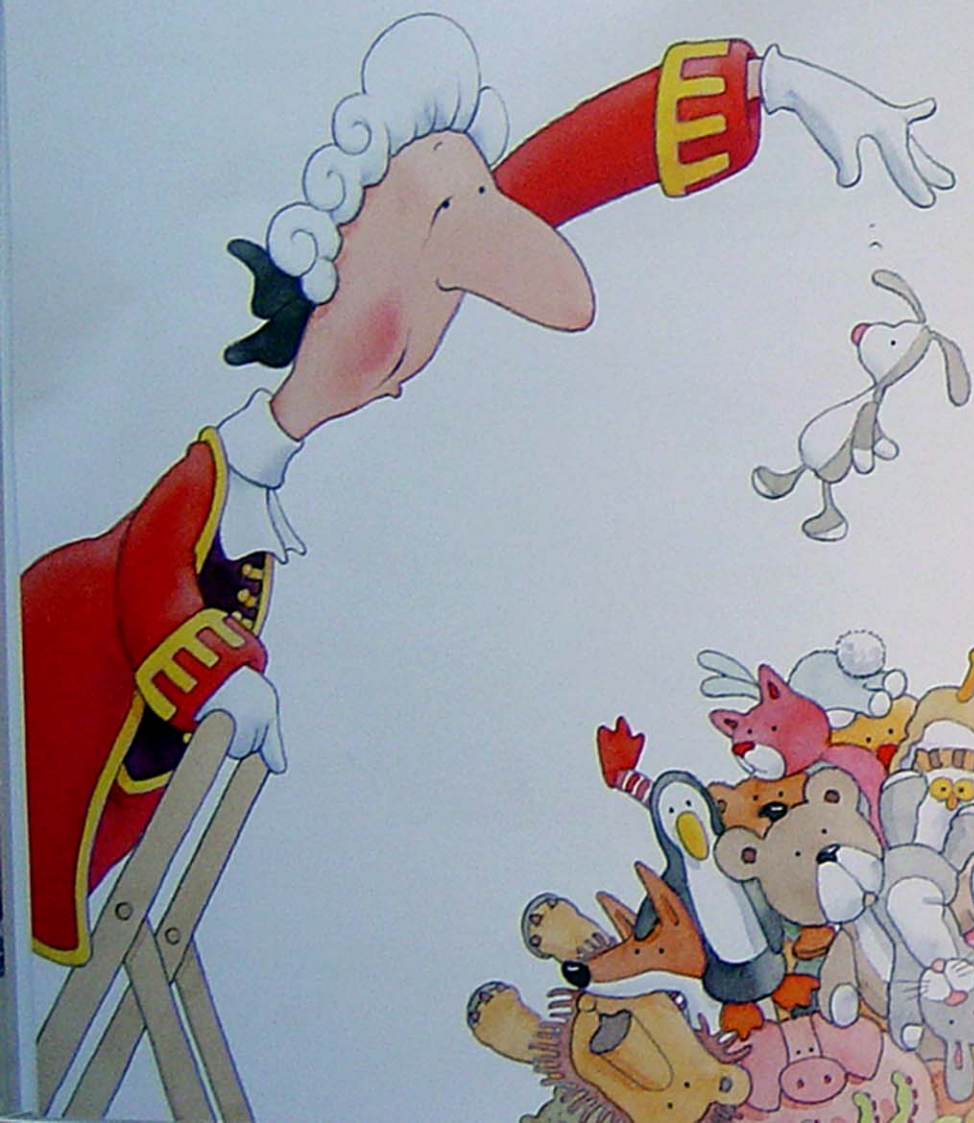

In fact her cries were so upsetting that the King and Queen had to pull their crowns over their ears!



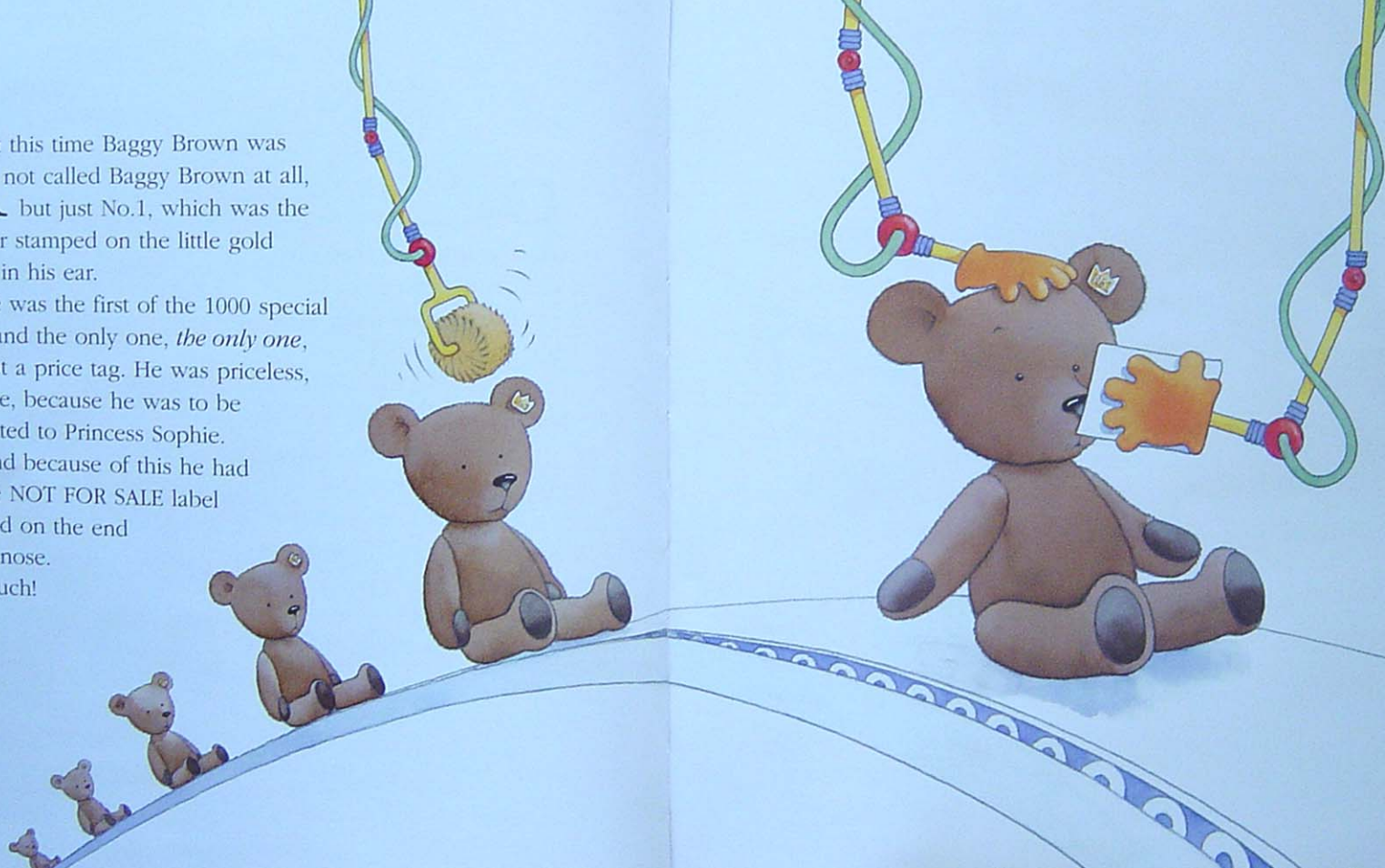


At this time Baggy Brown was not called Baggy Brown at all, but just No.1, which was the number stamped on the little gold crown in his ear.

Ouch!

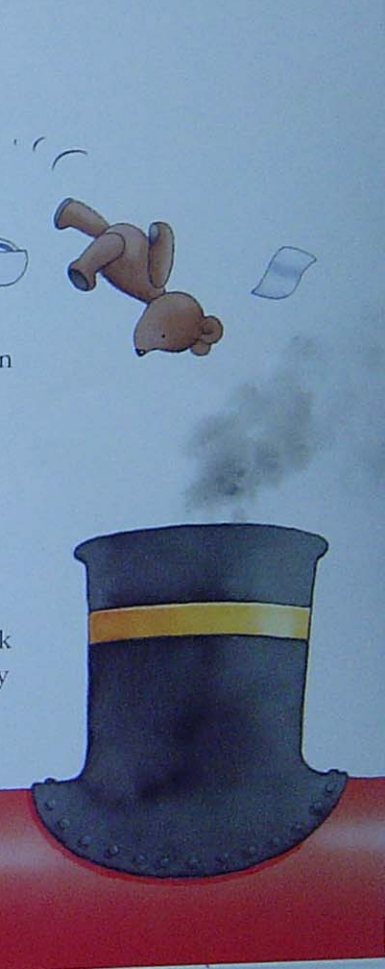




It was such a shock that Baggy Brown did not line himself up properly when the big grabber came round. It missed him completely!
