



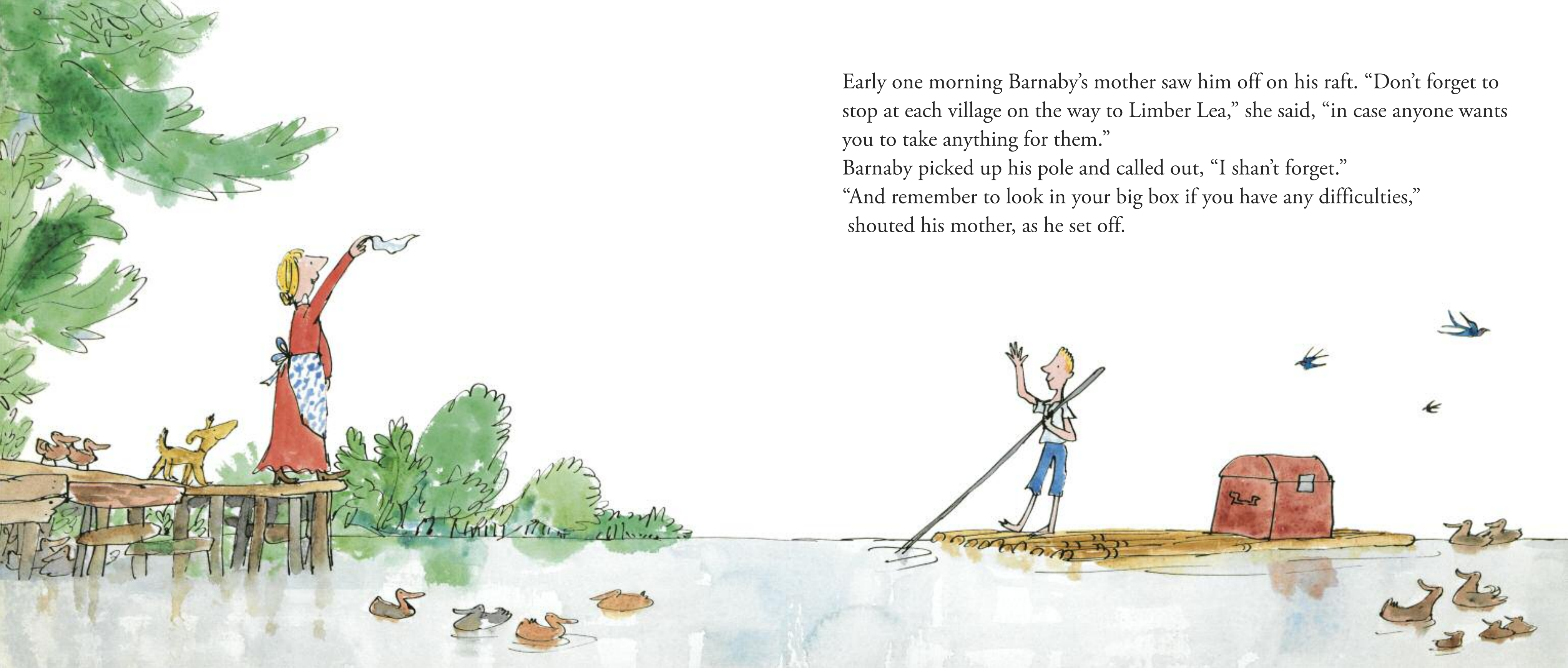
SIXES AND SEVENS
